On June 1, 2024, we had the privilege of conducting a training session for ADEM students during their Family Day event. This training aimed to raise awareness about human trafficking, covering its definition, indicators, and impact both locally and globally. With over 400 participants in attendance, the session underscored the importance of education in combating this crime. Strengthening Efforts Against Trafficking in Persons

As part of our **"KESHO NJEMA"** project, implemented by the Eco Scope Foundation, we are committed to combating the **trafficking of children**, who are often exploited through forced labor, illegal adoption, and other forms of abuse. We firmly believe that addressing **extreme poverty is key** to reducing human trafficking and are dedicated to ensuring that no one is left behind.





Joining Forces at the International Day Against Human Trafficking

The Eco Scope Foundation had the privilege of joining antitrafficking stakeholders, led by DMI, in Kibamba, Dar es Salaam. This gathering took place a week before the commemoration of the International Day Against Human Trafficking. Invited by the Secretariat of Anti-Human Trafficking under the Ministry of Home Affairs, our **Director, Mr. Damian Edward**, represented the Eco Scope Foundation. During the dialogue, we contributed to advancing our **"KESHO NJEMA"** project, which is dedicated to rescuing, preventing, and providing opportunities for victims of human trafficking.
