Since our inception 2023, we have been working hard to Support the national Development Agenda and Sustainable Development goals.





The Digital and Financial Literacy program at TIA has trained 220 students, equipping them with essential skills for navigating the digital economy and managing finances effectively.

Overview: In January 2024, Eco Scope Foundation launched its flagship project aimed at equipping Tanzanian college and university students with essential digital and financial literacy skills.

The project began with a pilot session at the Tanzania Institute of Accountancy in Dar es Salaam, engaging nearly 400 students in interactive sessions.

This initiative forms part of our Youth Responsiveness Window, designed to address unemployment, economic opportunities, and digital risks among youth, ultimately reducing poverty through empowerment.





The Kesho Njema project has trained 37 human trafficking survivors and engaged 400 government officials in Dar es Salaam, aiming to enhance awareness and capacity in combating human trafficking.

Overview: In collaboration with the Society of Daughters of Mary Immaculate & Collaborators (DMI) Tanzania, Eco Scope Foundation launched the KESHO NJEMA Project in January 2024. This initiative empowers survivors of human trafficking, women, and youth by providing financial knowledge and practical skills for self-reliance, directly addressing poverty alleviation.

- Facilitated a training session for over 400 ADEM students in June 2024, raising awareness about human trafficking and its socioeconomic impacts.




